BACKGROUND

The purpose of this report is to present the Board of Health with the 2013 operating results for Public Health Programs. Ottawa Public Health (OPH) management actively review quarterly results to ensure that spending and revenue results are not indicative of any underlying issues needing to be highlighted or addressed.

The 2013 operating budget year end results present actual year end revenues and expenditures against the amounts previously budgeted for the year.

DISCUSSION

Document 1 provides operating budget details on year end results for the various Ontario Public Health Standards. Financial information is presented by funding type, which includes cost-shared (75% province and 25% city); city funded (100% municipal); and provincial or federal funded (100% provincial or federal) along with a breakdown by specific program.

Document 2 provides compensation information showing the actual salary, benefits and overtime costs incurred by OPH for the full 2013 budget year.

Year End Results

As indicated in the Q2 operating status report OPH was projecting a balanced financial position for the 2013 fiscal year. OPH ended with a small deficit of \$0.014 million, which represents 0.03 percent of the \$52.21 million total operating expenditure budget. The deficit will be funded by municipal revenue in order to balance the year.

2013 Accomplishments

Provincial One-time Funding

In 2013, OPH achieved increased funding during the Ministry of Health and Long-Term Care's annual one-time funding request process. The province approved one-time funding totalling \$695K. Initiatives included: Vaccine Room Retrofit (\$301K), West Nile Mapping tool (\$20K), Catch-up Vaccination Clinics (\$50K), Peer-based HIV Testing Blitz (\$82K), Tablets for Smoke-Free Ontario Enforcement (\$24K), and French Language Community of Practice (\$83K). Provincial approval was received on August 15. All funding available to Dec 31, 2013 was fully expensed by the deadline.

In 2014, OPH will apply for additional one-time funding as part of the Ministry's annual grant application process.

Vaccine Room Retrofit

The construction activities were completed on time and on budget. The new integrated Vaccine Distribution Centre opened for business in September 2013, as planned, to align with the start of the flu season and the school immunization cycle. The total expenditures were \$297K on an approved budget of \$301K.

Year End Compensation Results

Document 2 shows the operating status for OPH compensation expenditures up to December 31, 2013. The year-end financial information shows OPH has spent 100% of its total compensation budget during the 2013 fiscal year.

Operating Budget Adjustments and Transfers

A summary of the budget adjustments and transfers made, either through the delegated authority given to the Medical Officer of Health or through Board and Council approved reports, is included in the quarterly operating status reports. Table 2 identifies the budget adjustment made during Q3 of 2013. There were no budget adjustments in Q4.
